



THE COLOURS SYSTEM

Half Colours: Red Braid Pockets and Cuffs of Blazer

Criteria - Pupils must:

- Have an excellent record of attendance and commitment to their chosen interest/activity over a period of at least three consecutive years - including year of award.
- Have a positive attitude.
- Set a good example to other pupils.
- Be helpful in their behaviour towards others.
- Pupils must agree to wear the blazer.

Half Colours could be a first stage towards full Colours.

Half Colours are not awarded for Academic Achievement.

Colours Tie

A tie may be awarded to any pupil who has already achieved Full Colours and who has continued to make exceptional and outstanding achievements or service to school or community.

Full Colours: Red Braid around the Blazer Prefects: Red Braid on Cuffs Additional Colours: Red Braid Cuffs and Pockets

Criteria - Primarily for excellence, outstanding service and commitment.

Pupils must:

- Fulfil or have undertaken this activity/or service over at least three years.
- Have outstanding conduct in the activity/or service.
- Must also fulfil the specific criteria for the activity or service.
- Pupils must agree to wear the blazer.

Pupils can be awarded Colours in several categories and in different years.

Colours awards will take place:

September - at Assembly.

April - Full Colours Awards Ceremony.



THE COLOURS SYSTEM

- Recognises achievement and service to the school and the wider community.
- It entitles pupils to wear the blazer and braid.
- Colours may be awarded as “Half Colours” award, “Full Colours” award or “Colours Tie”.

Colours are awarded for outstanding school, community achievement in the following areas:

SPORTING ACHIEVEMENT

SERVICE TO THE SCHOOL
